South Carolina is ripe with budding entrepreneurs who have new and innovative ideas in specialty crops (fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops), meat products, aquaculture, timber, agritourism, hydroponics or aquaponics, container or indoor farming, mechanical harvesting, agribusiness technology, and any other innovative agriculture practices.

ACRE serves this audience with two entrepreneurship grant programs:

Carolina. It is held in the fall every year, with five two-hour virtual courses spread out over five weeks, concluding with an online pitch day in November. Participants will receive training in marketing, financial planning, value-added processes, legal requirements, state and federal grant opportunities, and more. Upon completion of the program, each participant will have built their own business plan, receive a certificate verifying successful completion, and will have the opportunity to pitch their business for the chance to be awarded one of six \$5,000 grants. This is a free but competitive program, and nts must

The Advanced Program takes place every spring and is designed for established agribusinesses. Applicants must have their business operations in South Carolina, possess a business plan, and have an existing product with sales or services provided. Applicants selected as finalists will be asked to pitch their business to a panel of judges. Anywhere from 5–12 awardees will be chosen from this group of finalists. Awardees receive up to \$25,000 in grant funding, professional assistance with further state and federal grant applications, and promotion of their product across the state and beyond. Previous businesses awarded have been specialty crops (luffa, sea beans, tea, lavender, mushrooms), aquaculture (hydroponics, shellfish farming), dairies (cow, goat, sheep), value-added row crops (cotton, peanuts), fertilizer, and agricultural education, tourism, and technology operations.

Successes

Since 2017, ACRE has:

- · Given grants totaling \$1,253,500 to 112 entrepreneurs
- Provided intensive agribusiness training to 122 entrepreneurs
- Hosted agricultural workshops for 2,550 state residents ('18-'24)
- Served people in every South Carolina county
- Received 7 USDA Rural Business Development Grants and 4 Rural Cooperative Development Grant to extend our reach in rural South Carolina
